QUICK REFERENCE.

(Please read all KDNTA By-laws)

COURTS: To be opened by 7.15pm. [By-Law: 10]

ALL team members are to be at the courts and ready to play by 7.30pm.

SCORECARDS & MAILFORMS: [By-Law: 8]

- Use the correct scorecard,
- Fill out playersnames prior to start of match,
- Enter scores correctly,
- Scorecard should be signed by both captains after the match.
- VISITING captains are responsible for their team details on the scorecard . this includes listing your club name and the players in the correct order.
- **MAILFORM must be sent by 7pm the following night.** [By-Law: 8(i)]
- **Scorecards are to be kept until end of season in case required**

WASHOUT: [By-Law:12] The **HOME** team sends the mailform.

FORFEIT: [By-Law: 11] The team giving a forfeit shall inform the opposing team **and** the relevant Record Secretary as early as possible. **The team receiving the forfeit** must send the mailform.

SUBSTITUTE Players: [By-Law: 4] (**Section 1 excepted**) Must not strengthen the originally graded team and must be registered on the mailform with their details on the night they are first used. Their details are: FULL disclosure of the last section and Association played. If they have not played competition tennis before, they must be rated against a current player from the same club.

LATE MAILFORM: [By-Law: 8i & j] It is strongly recommended the home team captain sends the mailform on the night of the match. There is a \$10 fine and a 2 point penalty for late mailforms and a possible forfeit if the mailform has not been received prior to the commencement of the following round.

FINALS & Last Match: [By-Law: 6 & 8k]

- A player must play AT LEAST 3 matches to play in Finals.
- **LAST ROUND** the **HOME** team must mailform the results to Record Secretary before 7pm the following day.
- **ALL FINALS** the **WINNING** team must mailform the results to Record Secretary before 7pm the following day.

Team Captains: PLEASE KEEP RECORDS OF MATCH RESULTS.

Mailforms from all matches, whether played or not, must be received by the relevant Record Secretary as per the following table:

The By-Laws (Last reviewed **June 2008**, amendments since)

1. LAWS

The rules of Tennis as adopted by the governing body of tennis in Victoria shall apply to all matches conducted by this Association, except as hereinafter.

2. COMPETITION FORMAT

The Executive shall arrange night competition play over two seasons per calendar year and at all times the Executive will determine dates, times and formats at their discretion.

3. ENTERING TEAMS

- (a) Affiliated clubs may enter any number of teams in each competition providing that use of an appropriately equipped court(s) has been arranged for each team nominated.
- (b) A team registration fee as determined at the Annual General Meeting each year shall accompany team entries. If the team entry fee does not accompany the team application the Executive reserves the right to reject that team's nomination. Non payment within 14 days will incur a \$100 fine. [Bylaw 19m]
- (c) If team registration fees, fines and/or any other monies owed (as highlighted by the Treasurer as outstanding) are unpaid by the first match of a new season, all players registered by that club will be deemed to be unregistered. All points won shall be forfeited for each match played while there are monies outstanding. Lost points will not be reinstated.
- (d) Teams must be submitted on or before the closing date for entries as determined by the Executive and be on an official Association Team Registration Form. All players being nominated by the clubs must be financial members of a KDNTA club. [see by-law 6(a)]
- (e) Each club is required to nominate the section in which it desires to enter a team, but the Executive reserves the right to grade any team as it deems fit.
- (f) When a club enters more than one (1) team in the one section, they are to be named numerically [e.g. one (1), two (2), three (3) etc] with team one (1) to be regarded as the higher standard team, two (2) as the next highest standard and so on.
- (g) Each Season shall consist of at least fourteen (14) matches and at least two (2) complete rounds of matches where possible.

4. REGISTRATION OF PLAYERS

- (a) At the commencement of each season, each entry must be accompanied by a graded list of players and emergencies on the prescribed form for registration for that season.
- (b) Team entries as submitted will be graded into sections by the Grading Sub-Committee. All players listed in the teams as submitted by Clubs must play in the section as graded. No player so graded will be permitted to play in a lower section without prior permission from the Executive or its nominated Sub-Committee.

- (c) If a player is nominated for registration by more than one club, the player concerned shall have the right to say which nomination shall stand. The Executive Committee shall have the right to reject any nomination.
- (d) Emergencies cannot play below the grade assigned to them by the Association, which will be that nominated by the Club unless otherwise determined by the Executive Committee.
- (e) Applications for additional player registration will be permitted on the official mailform provided that full disclosure of the last grade and Association played is declared on the mailform.
- (f) Failure to provide appropriate information may deem that player to be unregistered and Bylaw 4(h) will apply.
- (g) The Executive reserves the right to reject any application for registration of an additional player where it is deemed that such player strengthens that particular team (except Section 1).
- (h) Any club that, **without prior approval of the appropriate Record Secretary**, plays an unregistered player or one who is ineligible to play in a team, shall forfeit to love all sets in which such player participated and shall be fined in accordance with the fines schedule as per Bylaw 19(e).
- (i) If a match is a **forfeit** or a **total washout** (no play commenced) emergency players will not be registered.

5. TRANSFER OF PLAYERS

- (a) A registered player who wishes to transfer to another club during the season must obtain a clearance from the club for which they are registered.
- (b) When an application for a clearance is approved by a club, notification to the effect, signed by the club Secretary, shall be forwarded to the Secretary of the Association and the Secretary of the club to which the player is transferring.
- (c) No clearance is valid and effective until it is received in writing by the Association Secretary, in accordance with the constitution.
- (d) A player whose clearance application has not been considered by their club within thirty (30) days, or whose clearance has been refused, may appeal to the Executive which shall reserve the right to grant a clearance if on the basis of evidence placed before it deems it appropriate.

6. ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS

- (a) All players registered for team entry must be financial members of a KDNTA club and must have adequate insurance.
- (b) If a club has two or more teams in any competition, no player shall be eligible to play in a lower section in that competition after having played three (3) matches in a higher section or sections.
- (c) If a Club is represented by more than one team in any one section, no player having participated in three (3) matches in one team shall be eligible to play thereafter in another team in the section.

- (d) To be eligible to play in any Finals matches, players must have been registered as a team player for that section or lower in three (3) matches in which play actually commenced during that season.
- (e) Any emergency qualified to play in the finals must not strengthen the originally graded team, except Section 1.
- (f) The Executive shall reserve the right to allow a player to participate in finals matches without having played the required number of matches, but only in exceptional circumstances and after having all relevant facts placed before them for consideration.
- (g) The Executive has the right at all times to stipulate the lowest section in which a player may compete.

7. SUBSTITUTION OF PLAYERS

- (a) If because of illness, accident, or other emergency a player cannot continue in a match, a substitute may take their place. The current set shall be forfeited with the winning team given 6 games and the forfeiting team keeping games already scored. The substitute player may play the remaining sets of the match.
- (b) A substitute must be an eligible player of the club concerned. If a substitute player is not available immediately after such illness, accident, or emergency the match shall be continued, leaving out the sets for which the substitute is required.
- (c) If a substitute is not available within fifteen (15) minutes of the completion of the sets possible to be played, the club will be considered not to have scored any further games in any sets for which the substitute was required.
- (d) Once a substitute player has started play, they must, if necessary, be prepared to complete all their sets without a rest break.
- (e) The names of all substitute players used must appear on the match mailform in the place of the defaulting player. A suitable written explanation for the substitution must be entered on the mailform.
- (f) If a finals match is carried over to another day a substitute player approved by the Executive shall be permitted to take the place of any player who is prevented from continuing that match through illness, injury or any other good and sufficient reason. The opposing team shall be notified by the Association Secretary of any such substitution approval.

8. CONDUCT OF MATCHES

- (a) Prior to the commencement of each season the Executive shall determine the competition format for that season.
- (b) **Doubles Team Composition**

Mixed teams shall consist of 2 Ladies and 2 Men

Mens teams shall consist of 4 Men

Ladies teams shall consist of 4 Ladies

All matches consist of six "six game" sets played in the order listed on the scorecard. A 12 point tie-breaker shall be played when sets are five (5) games all. (Finals refer Bylaw 16d).

(c) **Singles Team Composition**

Open format of 2 players may be any combination of Male or Female.

All matches consist of five "six game" sets played in the order listed on the scorecard. A 12 point tie-breaker shall be played when sets are five (5) games all. (Finals refer Bylaw 16d).

- (d) The order of play in any match may be varied by agreement between the team captains.
- (e) To qualify for Finals participation a player must have met the requirements of Bylaw 6.
- (f)
 - (i) The scorecard shall be provided by the home team and given to each team captain who is to fill in the first name and surname of each member of the team prior to the commencement of play. Any alterations to the scorecard must be approved and initialed by both team captains. Extra registrations information is to be sent with the mailform.
 - (ii) Any team member not sufficiently identified on the mailform shall be deemed an unregistered player and the match result shall be determined in accordance with Bylaw 4(h) and fined in accordance with Bylaw 19(e).
 - (iii) Each club captain is responsible for the accuracy of their team's information provided on the scorecard. The club responsible for submitting the mailform [8j & 8k] shall ensure the completeness and accuracy of the date, section and competition.
 - (iv) The club responsible for the accuracy and completeness of the mailform details, as above, shall incur a fine for inaccurate and incomplete details in accordance with Bylaw 19(j).
- (g) Matches shall be decided on games first. If games are equal the match shall then be decided on sets.
- (h) At the conclusion of play the final details shall be completed on the scorecard and both captains shall sign the scorecard as a true and accurate record of the match.
- (i)
 - (i) Mailforms from all matches, whether played or not, must be received by the relevant Record Secretary as per the following table:

If the due day is a public holiday, the following working day will be accepted.

The sooner the results are in the better!

(ii) MAILFORM rules:

- (a) If you don't get confirmation within 24 hours of Mailform Received from the Record Secretary, then you are required to follow up with appropriate Record Secretary.
 - (b) Scorecards must be either retained until the end of the season or passed on to your Club's Delegate so they can hand them in at the next Delegates Meeting. Captains to check with your Club Delegate. Scorecards are required for possible insurance purposes and spot checking of scores & all players registered.
- (j) If a mail form is not received as above the home team may be penalised two (2) points per late Mail Form and fined in accordance with Bylaw 19(a). If the mail form has not been received by the relevant Record Secretary prior to the commencement of the following round, the home team (**which is responsible for forwarding the mail form**) may be deemed to have forfeited the match with points awarded to the away team to reflect a forfeit.
- (k) For the **LAST** home and away match the **HOME** team, and for **ALL FINALS** matches the captain of the **WINNING** team shall, in accordance with the Bylaws and no later than 7:00pm on the following day of the match, inform the Record Secretary of the match result by mailform only. Failure to comply will incur a fine in accordance with Bylaw 19(a).
- (l) For each match being played in doubles competitions a minimum of four new balls shall be provided by the home team.
- (m) For singles competition being played on two courts, four new balls shall be provided by the home team.
- (n) All balls used must be those balls as approved by Tennis Australia and/or the controlling body of Tennis in the State of Victoria.

Note: As a courtesy to all players, all mobile phones are to be turned off.

9. COURT REQUIREMENTS

- (a) The type, condition and surroundings of each competing Club's courts shall meet appropriate safety standards as regulated by the governing body of tennis in Victoria and be subject to the approval of the Executive.
- (b) The Executive may require any club to make repairs to their courts and surroundings that they deem necessary.
- (c) Any club failing to make such repairs will need to provide an alternative venue until such time as the repairs have been completed to the satisfaction of the Executive. Failure to make such repairs may lead to the Club being suspended from the Association.
- (d) The provision of an alternative venue requires Executive approval prior to any matches being played at the venue.
- (e) Where more than one (1) court is used for any one match they must be of the same surface, unless otherwise agreed by both captains.

10. STARTING TIMES AND LATE TIME LIMITS

- (a) Matches shall be played at the venue shown on the fixture and all matches shall commence by 7.30p.m. at the latest. All members of both teams must be ready to play prior to this time. All clubs will have their courts and facilities open and available for play by 7.15p.m. Failure to do so may incur a fine in accordance with Bylaw 19(c).
- (b) If a team is not ready to play by 7.45p.m. they will forfeit the first set 0-6 and may incur a fine in accordance with Bylaw 19(i). For each full fifteen (15) minutes that they are late thereafter the next set to be played shall also be forfeited 0-6. Play shall commence at the set after those forfeited.
- (c) If all team members are not in attendance by 8.15p.m. the match shall be abandoned, regarded as a forfeit and a fine may be incurred in accordance with Bylaw 19(b). If both teams are in default the match shall be cancelled, treated as a double forfeit and no match points allocated. Both teams may incur a fine in accordance with Bylaw 19(b).
- (d) All play will cease at 10:30pm.
- (e) All hit ups between sets are to be restricted to a maximum of three (3) minutes.

11. FORFEITS

- (a) Any club that cannot field a team for a particular match shall inform the opposing team and the Association Record Secretary as early as possible, prior to the proposed commencement of play. Once a forfeit has been given, it cannot be retracted. Unless written evidence of extraordinary circumstances is provided to the Executive, a fine will be incurred in accordance with Bylaw 19(b).
- (b) The team receiving the forfeit must forward a mailform to the Record Secretary listing the section number, club names, Receives Forfeit/Gives Forfeit and date. The team not defaulting shall be awarded all match points.
- (c) Failure to notify the Association Record Secretary may result in a fine in accordance with by-law 19(d). Notification may be made by phone or mail form.
- (d) Failure to notify your opposition in person of a forfeit may result in a fine & loss of points in accordance to by-law 19(k). If you are unable to speak with your opposition by phone, you are required to attend the courts to notify them in person.

12. WASHOUTS

- (a) If due to inclement weather the home court is unplayable, the match shall be declared a washout and the visiting team notified as soon as possible, but not before 6.30pm on the day in question. If play has not commenced by 8.15p.m. the match shall be deemed a washout.
- (b) In the case of a total washout, only the home team needs to send a mailform to the appropriate Record Secretary. The mailform is to be sent in accordance with the time limitations prescribed in Bylaw 8(i). Match points will be allocated in accordance with Bylaw 15(c).

- (c) Home teams that do not lodge a mailform for a washout will be deemed to have forfeited the match and will be fined in accordance with Bylaw 19(b).
- (d) Home and away matches may be transferred to another KDNTA approved venue if both captains agree.
- (e) Failure to notify your opposition in person of a washout may result in a fine & loss of points in accordance to by-law 19(k). If you are unable to speak to your opposition by phone, you are required to attend the courts to notify them in person.

13. INCOMPLETE MATCHES

- (a) An incomplete match is one in which inclement weather or other external conditions [eg: rain, frost, light, time, safety concerns, etc] causes play to cease before the match has reached a conclusion.
- (b) All completed sets and games will be counted towards determining if a result has been reached.
- (c) If a match cannot finish, the actual scores shall be recorded on the scorecard, signed by both captains and a mailform with the actual scores sent to the appropriate Record Secretary by the home team.
- (d) Home and away matches may be transferred to another venue if both captains agree.

14. PROTESTS

- (a) A letter of protest, forwarded via your KDNTA Club Delegate or an authorised representative of your club, must be lodged in writing no later than four (4) days immediately following the match.
- (b) The KDNTA Secretary will confirm receipt of the complaint in writing and forward the complaint to the opposing club's Delegate.
- (c) The opposing club must acknowledge receipt of the complaint and provide a response to the complaint in writing no later than four (4) days from the date the complaint is forwarded by KDNTA. The response must include:
 - (i) a concession that the allegations are true and correct in whole or in part, whichever applies; or
 - (ii) provide its version of events if it disagrees with the allegation(s);

In the event that the opposing club concedes that the allegations are true and correct in whole or in part, the opposing club may provide a written submission of no more than one page to the KDNTA Executive as to the disciplinary action it considers to be appropriate in the circumstances of the complaint.

- (d) No later than four (4) days after receipt of the opposing club's response, the KDNTA Secretary will forward the response to the Protesting club for its response. The protesting club must provide its written response no later than four(4) days from the date the opposing club's response is forwarded by the KDNTA

- (e) The KDNTA Secretary will confirm receipt of the protesting club's response in writing and provide a copy of the response to the opposing club.
- (f) The KDNTA Executive Committee will:
 - (i) Consider all versions of events & responses; and
 - (ii) Consider all previous complaints involving the players named in the complaint, including any previous disciplinary action taken; and
 - (iii) Make a determination. An executive meeting may be required for complex cases.
- (g) The determination will be provided in writing to the protesting club, the opposition club and the players named in the complaint within 24 hours of the determination being made. The determination will include the following:
 - (i) A summary of the determination and the disciplinary action to be taken if any or all of the complaint is substantiated;
 - (ii) If any or all of the complaint is substantiated, a written warning in accordance with rule 14(i) to any or all players named in the complaint; and
 - (iii) A summary to club only of any determination made against the Opposing Club.
- (h) All correspondence will be forwarded by the KDNTA Secretary to the KDNTA Executive Committee via email.
- (i) The KDNTA Strike system will operate as follows:
 - (i) 1st strike = First Official warning in writing by KDNTA submitted to both player & club via email and mail.
 - (ii) 2nd strike = Final official warning in writing by KDNTA hand delivered to the player & club representative in person at an organised meeting with 2 KDNTA Executive Committee members present.
 - (iii) 3rd strike = Official suspension determined by KDNTA advised in person with a formal letter at an organised meeting with 2 KDNTA Executive Committee members present.
 - (iv) Further strikes against a player will incur more severe penalties and will be entirely at the discretion of the KDNTA Executive.
- (j) If the KDNTA deems an offence to constitute serious misconduct, the KDNTA Executive reserves the right to suspend the player at its discretion without following the Strike System outlined in 14(i)
- (k) The KDNTA Executive decision is final

15. ALLOCATION OF POINTS AND PERCENTAGES

- (a) The winning team from each match shall be awarded two (2) points. In the event of a tie, each team shall be awarded one (1) point. Each team shall also be awarded one (1) point for each set won.
- (b) If a decision is reached in an unfinished match the winner shall be awarded two (2) points. Each team shall be awarded one (1) point for each set won and half of the available points for the unfinished sets. The score as at the end of the match shall be used for the calculation of the relevant percentages.
- (c) If a decision is not reached in an unfinished match each team shall be awarded one (1) point plus one (1) point for each set won and half of the available points for the unfinished sets. The score at the end of the match shall be used for the calculation of the relevant percentages.
- (d) In calculating percentages, a team winning a match by forfeit shall be deemed to have won 24/0 Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & 18/0 Thursday. A team losing a match by forfeit shall incur the penalty of being deemed to have lost all sets of the relevant match to love and fined in accordance with Bylaw 19(b).
- (e) If a team is moved from one section to another by the Executive, treatment of points won by the team in their original section shall be determined by the Executive.
- (f) If a team enters the competition after the start of the season to take up a bye, they will be granted 2 points for each scheduled match prior to their entry.
- (g) Percentages shall be calculated as the total number of games won divided by the total number of games lost and multiplied by 100.
- (h) Byes: each team will be awarded half points for a match.

16. LADDER STANDINGS AND FINALS

- (a) Positions on the ladder shall be determined by points.
- (b) In the event of points being equal, percentage of games won shall be next considered and if that is still equal, the percentage of sets won shall be considered next. If everything is still equal at the end of the Home and Away matches, the position on the ladder will be determined by the match results between the teams involved.

- (c) After the completion of all Home and Away matches the first four teams in each section shall play off for the premiership of that particular section. Finals are to be played as follows:
- (i) **8 Team Section:** (Regular Finals Series)
 - First Semi-Final:** First team versus Second team
 - Second Semi-Final:** Third team versus Fourth team
 - Preliminary Final:** First Semi-Final Loser plays Second Semi-Final Winner
 - Grand Final:** First Semi-Final Winner plays Preliminary Final Winner
 - (ii) **6 Team Section:** (Knock-out Final Series)
 - First Semi-Final:** First team versus Fourth team
 - Second Semi-Final:** Second team versus Third team
 - Grand Final:** First Semi-Final Winner plays Second Semi-Final Winner
- (d) For all Final matches, a 12 point tie-breaker shall be played when sets are at six games all.
- (e) The Executive shall arrange finals and the courts on which they are to be played. Two courts are to be allocated for each match where possible and/or practicable.
- (f) The hosting venue is to provide balls & collect all ball money
- (g) Grand Finals should be played on an en-tous-cas surface at a venue determined by the appropriate Record Secretary
- (h) All finals matches shall commence play by 7.30p.m. All players must be in attendance and ready to play prior to that time. The club at which the match is to be played shall have the court open and available for play from 7.00p.m. Failure to do so will incur for the club whose courts are not open a fine in accordance with Bylaw 19(c).
- (i) In the event of a drawn finals match, each team captain shall *exchange* an undisclosed pair to play one additional and deciding set, to a twelve (12) point tie-breaker if the games reach six (6) all. **Note:** In Mixed Competition the pairs shall be Mixed.
- (j) For whatever reason a Finals match cannot be finished on the scheduled date, play shall be continued from where it was left off at the same venue and normal starting time the following week. Opposing team captains may agree to reconvene the match at a suitable date, time and venue within 7 days of the abandoned match. **Note:** Record Secretary must be advised of any washouts or schedule alterations.
- (k) Where the opposing captains are unable to agree on a suitable time and date to resume the match, it will be decided by the Executive and both teams will be required to abide by the Executive's decision.

- (l) If the Grand Final can not be completed by the start of the next season then No Winner+will be awarded.

17. TENNIS ATTIRE

- (a) Only recognised tennis garments and footwear may be worn as directed by the governing body of tennis in Victoria except where listed below.
- (b) Footwear suitable for the type of surface being used shall be worn in all KDNTA sanctioned tennis matches. Footwear with ripple soles or heels are not permitted at any time.
- (c) Tracksuits may be worn during the course of the match, provided standard tennis attire is also worn. For Ladies, skirts or shorts are optional with tracksuit.

18. TROPHIES

- (a) Each season the winning Grand Final team in each section shall be awarded a Premiership pennant.
- (b) A Runners Up pennant shall be awarded to the team defeated in each Grand Final.

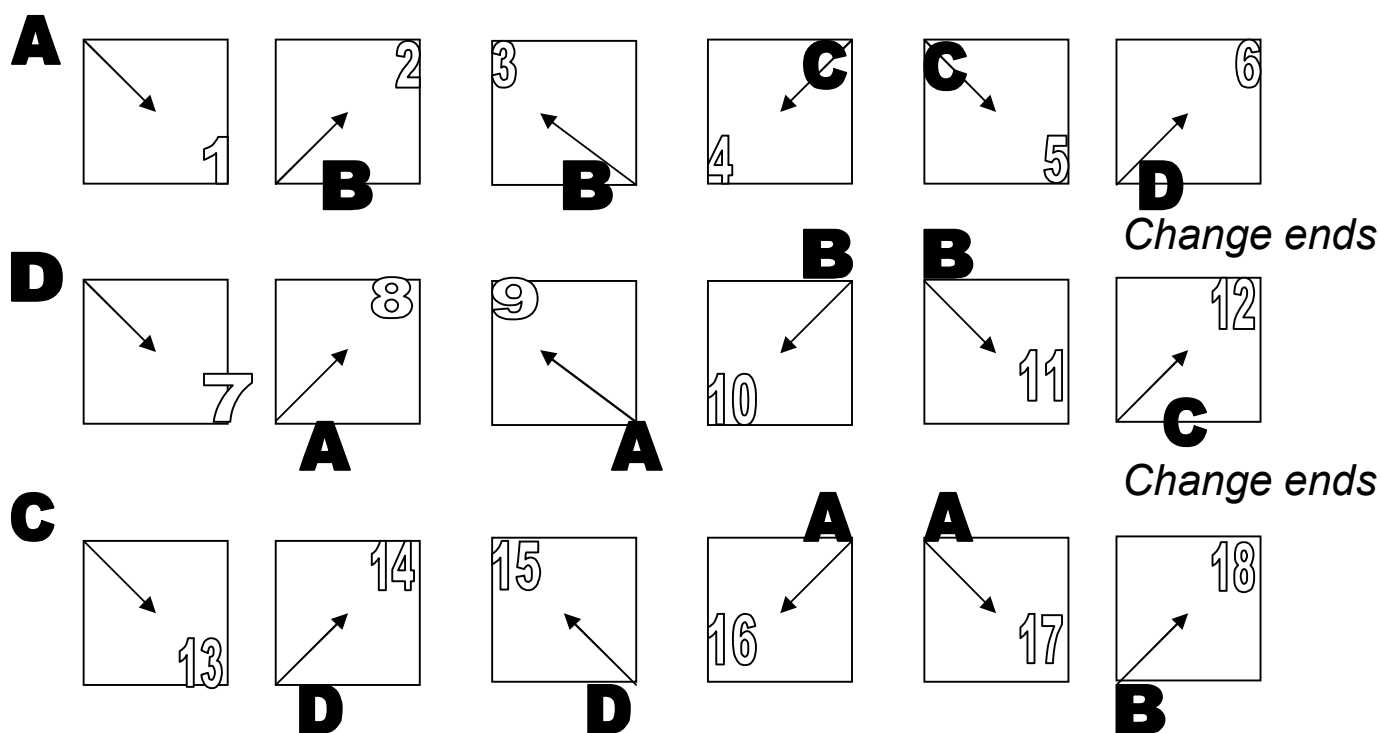

12 POINT TIE BREAKER

The following system shall be used when any match is drawn on game and sets. (5-all in home and away matches, 6-all in finals matches)



Change ends and so on until one pair reaches seven points and two points clear.

- (a) The pair who first wins seven points shall win the match provided they lead by a margin of two points. If the score reaches six points all, the game shall be extended until this margin has been achieved.
- (b) The player whose turn it is to serve shall be the server for the first point. Thereafter each player shall serve in rotation for two points, in the same order as previously in that set, until the winners of the game have been decided.
- (c) From the first point, each service shall be delivered alternately from the right court.
- (d) Players shall change ends after every six points.

NOTE: Odd points are served from right court. Even points are served from left court.

REMEMBER

The first player to serve, serves only one point and thereafter every player serves two consecutive points throughout.
